Description and Current Status

The School division needs to make HVAC improvements at existing Walton Elementary, and has a funding deficit of \$170,767.87 for Phase I of those improvements.

There are *unallocated Spring 2019 bond proceeds* in the amount of \$160,782. \$273,473 was originally allocated for bond issuance (closing) costs, and only \$112,691 was used. *A public hearing is required for use of bond proceeds for a purpose not specified during the bond issuance public hearing*.

GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND (PUBLIC FACILITIES IMPROVEMENTS PROJECTS), SERIES 2019

The Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the County of Prince George, Virginia (the "County"), will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, **February 11, 2020** at 7:30 p.m. in the County Administration Building Boardroom, Third Floor, 6602 Courts Drive, Prince George, Virginia 23875, to consider adoption of a resolution allocating tax-exempt bond proceeds and accumulated interest from the County's currently outstanding \$9,450,000 General Obligation Bond (Public Facilities Improvements Projects) Series 2019 issued on April 4, 2019 (the "Spring Series 2019 Bond") to finance Walton Elementary HVAC improvements for the County's public school system, in a maximum principal amount not to exceed \$170,767.87 (the "School System Project").

The previously authorized Spring Series 2019 Bond will finance various other capital projects for County purposes in addition to the proposed School System Project. The projects already identified for financing with Spring Series 2019 Bond proceeds include: (i) the purchase of police vehicles and other law enforcement related assets; (ii) utility improvements – upgrades to the Food Lion Water System; (iii) utility improvements – water main extension along Route 156; (iv) improvements to entrances and security systems of public County owned buildings; (v) the replacement of software for use by the Real Estate Assessor; (vi) construction of a new fire station to replace Jefferson Park Fire Station; (vii) construction of a multi-purpose building at Scott Park; and; (viii) to pay costs of issuance (the "Projects").

The proposed resolution will confirm that the Spring Series 2019 Bond is a general obligation, the payment of which will be secured by the County's pledge of its full faith and credit and taxing power and that the School System Project may be financed with Spring Series 2019 Bond proceeds along with the other Projects.

All interested persons may appear and present their views to the Board at the public hearing.
