Description and Current Status

The County and school division currently utilize a number of private day facilities to furnish educational services to Prince George County PK-12 students through the Family Assessment and Planning Team (FAPT) / Children's Services Act (CSA). Finance & the Department of Social Services issued a request for proposals to formalize service expectations and rates with those educational providers.

RFP #20-0701-24 "CSA-Funded Services for Private Day Educational Services" was issued on March 4, 2020 and closed on April 2, 2020. This RFP and any addenda are available upon request and also available to view on eVA (the Commonwealth of Virginia's procurement platform).

Nine (9) proposals were received and evaluated by a staff committee consisting of: Shel Douglas, Director of Social Services Zettamae Ethington, School Director of Student Services Mary Bell, Children's Services Act Coordinator

The evaluation criteria for the providers included:

- Ability to meet Request for Proposal Terms
- Quality of vendor's history with Prince George County & Prince George County schools
- Understanding of responsibilities and qualifications
- Capability Statement Experience and Training

The staff recommendation is to contract with all responding providers to furnish educational services to students based on varying educational needs for FY2021 with four (4) possible annual renewals available.

As a result of the negotiation process, the County will see the following benefits:

- Annual rate increase cap of 2% (state-imposed limit)
- One monthly invoice from each provider combined monthly invoice for tuition and additional third-party services
- Volume Discount Rate reduction in rate per student if more students enrolled
- Discounted rate for distance learning services (discussed as a result of COVID-19)
- Placement hold rate if student is unable to participate in distance learning or is hospitalized
- 2-week priority waiting list

Staff is requesting the board to authorize:

 Authorization for the County Administrator to execute contracts with all nine (9) providers who submitted proposals

A resolution draft for board consideration is included in the board packet. The resolution approves administrative execution of the contracts.

Fiscal Impact Statement

There is no additional fiscal impact for the County. Annual services and costs vary depending on student needs and recommendations of the FAPT. The Children's Services Act (CSA) currently reimburses at a 62.84%, and the County's local match is 37.16%. The adopted FY2021 County budget includes \$1,350,000 for contracted educational day placement services; the adopted FY2020 total was \$1,537,000.
