## **Description and Current Status**

On May 26, at the Board's regular meeting, a presentation was provided to update the Board of the current capacity of the wastewater collection system for the Southpoint Business Park and the Route 460 corridor.

Dewberry recently updated the wastewater model to learn the remaining capacity of the sewer conveyance system is 120,000 - 140,0000 gallon per day.

New private developments are currently planned along the Route 460 corridor and within the business park. The County has also planned for future development within the Southpoint Business Park.

Continuing as a first-come, first-served basis utility will allow developments along Route 460 to continue and new developments within the business park will be considered alongside those applications for service. Restricting the capacity to the development of the business park will prevent further development along route 460 until such a time additional capacity is made available.
