

Description and Current Status



Prince George currently has insufficient water and wastewater capacity to serve this project. In order to secure financing for the project, among other requirements, Mr. Cunningham must identify a reliable source of potable water and domestic wastewater treatment. The County is taking steps to provide additional water and wastewater capacity to the Southpoint Business Park area. However, it will take 24 to 36 months to complete the necessary improvements to serve this part of the county.

Until the public water and wastewater improvements are complete, the applicant requests a waiver of the ordinance to allow them to install private water and wastewater facilities to serve the property.

The approval of an ordinance after a public hearing is required for a one-time waiver to County Code Section 82-311(a) and 82-591.

A resolution authorizing a public hearing to consider the waiver is attached for consideration; a motion approving the resolution is requested.

Sample Motion: I move that the Board approve the resolution authorizing the advertisement of a public hearing to consider a one-time waiver of Code Sections 82-311(a) and 82-591 to allow the use of private water and wastewater facilities to serve tax parcel 340(19)00-001-0 until the completion of the necessary public water and wastewater improvements to serve the property.

Dear Mr. Haltom:

As you know we recently completed a rezoning for several buildings to be placed on the above referenced site for its owner, Mr. Nelson Cunningham. At the time of the approval of this rezoning, it was made clear to us that the current utility capacity for both public water and sewer at this location was adequate for our proposed development, but limited. Since the time of our request's approval, we have now been notified that this remaining capacity has now been awarded to other projects closer to being ready for public utility service allocation and system construction.

Given this current fact, we hereby request that we be granted a Waiver to the Required Use of Public Utilities though your department and with the final approval of the Board of Supervisors. Upon this approval, we request that we be permitted a construct a private potable water well and septic drainfield for wastewater sytem treatment on our site, in lieu of using the public system. The locations of and the site conditions on our parcel for these systems have been preliminarily determined and we feel that this will be an excellent alternative to the public design. We understand that these components will need to be permitted through the Prince Heorge County Health Department to the standards of the Virginia Department of Health for such facilities.

We thank you and the Board for your consideration in this matter. Please advise when the item is placed on the next possible public hearing agenda. On a side note, we are pleased that the county is moving forward with the physical implementation of the January 2016 Water and Wastewater Master Plan. For too long now the county has been throttled by the lack of public facilities to accommodate growth and tax base expansion, so it is good to see your progress.
