Thank you for your agency's Transportation Assistance Program (TAP) Application. The Virginia Department of Social Services (VDSS) is pleased to inform you that your TAP (Budget Line 884-Chafee COVID) approved allocation is **\$4,629**.

The local departments of social services (LDSS) will receive 100% of their total TAP allocation around February 2, 2022. TAP allocations were based on statewide total number of eligible youth submitted by LDSS and then divided into the available VDSS allocation.

The Pandemic Act Division X of Consolidation Appropriation Act 2021 allows <u>up to \$4,000</u> of Chafee COVID funding to be used to provide driving and transportation assistance per youth. However, due to the overwhelming number of applications received documenting the number of reported youth in need of transportation assistance, VDSS was not able to provide a \$4,000 allocation for each youth. LDSS can use the TAP allocation to support Chafee Program eligible youth, ages 14 up to 23, with transportation assistance as they see fit up to \$4,000 per youth.

Budget Line 884 may be used for multiple types of transportation and driving assistance. If additional funds are needed, a BRS request can be submitted to Budget Line 884 in LASER (approval based on the availability of funds). Please ensure that the Chafee COVID expenditures are submitted monthly to your financial team.

REPORTING AND EVALUATION REQUIREMENTS

The TAP Program will be monitored and evaluated via submission of Chafee COVID quarterly reports and Locality Automated System for Expenditure Reimbursement (LASER) reports.
